



"It is important to capture memories so that people can have visual documentation to go with their written records," he said.






TUTELO LODGE 50 YEARS

This year's function patches are a nod to the lodge's first 50 years. "Tutelo Through the Decades" is based on past issues from 1973, 1983, 1993, 2003 and 2013. All 2023 function patches have a gold border and gold fleur-de-lis.



The Spring patch is a re-issue of the first event patch of the then newly-formed Tutelo Lodge in 1973. This design was also used in 1983 and 1993. The Summer Ordeal patch is from 1993. It was also used in 1981. The Fall Ordeal patch goes back to 1983. It was issued again in 1974. The Fall Fellowship patch is from 2003, which back then was actually four separate patches that combined to form one patch depicting a medicine wheel. The Winter Banquet patch was designed and used for the 2013 event.
